

LSC Professional Development Residency, PDR, 2019 Application Guidelines

Leitrim Sculpture Centre in association with the Arts Council is awarding four Professional Development Residencies during the months of August, September and November 2019. The residency provides artists, and other creative practitioners working in the field of contemporary visual arts, with the space, time and/or technical facilities for practical and/or conceptual research towards the development of new work.

Specifically the scheme supports artists wishing to explore new directions in their practice through experimental approaches to different materials, processes, ideas and/or techniques. It also supports creative research undertaken by artists and other practitioners such as curators, theorists, art historians and critics who wish to develop or explore contemporary arts practice within a rural context

Significantly this is offered to artist-researchers without the pressure of having to produce an exhibition, or specific project outcome-conclusion, during or at the end of the period. However a short presentation or talk of previous and/or present work to a small local audience is required as well as a short visual synopsis/report of work undertaken during the residency period.

The aims of the residencies are to

- Enhance an artist-researchers creative engagement with a range of specified materials, techniques or ideas chosen by the applicant
- Support the creative potential of this engagement for the future benefit of the applicant

Residency Supports

Each residency includes an artist's stipend of €1,000 and in addition comes with residential accommodation including a private and heated studio, broadband internet; the use of specified technical facilities and basic energy use. Energy for the kilns, foundry, forge or intensive energy use is metered and charged additionally.

General technical support for practice based work is provided during the period of the residency and specialist or in-depth technical support, if required, may be sourced through the Centre's list of freelance technicians and /or tutors at the recommended rate of €20 per hour. LSC also offers administrative and communication support in addressing creative requirements, locating supplies or other production needs. Curatorial support if requested is limited to one visit during the residency period. Artists are expected to be based and work at the Centre for the duration of the residency period although periods of absence can be arranged in advance if required.

The Centre's Resources

LSC is unique in offering a comprehensive range of technical facilities in stone, metal casting and fabrication, hot glass, ceramics, woodwork, digital and traditional print & design, and mouldmaking, in which artists may apply to use. LSC also houses a range of production spaces within its two buildings and has 18 studios, a superb gallery and an archive facility. These resources provide artists with the freedom to explore a specific medium or range of material processes of their choosing with no pressure, and/or conduct research towards more conceptual work if required.

Application Guidelines

Residencies are open to all artists based in Ireland and abroad. International artists are also welcome and if successful will need to find their own travel costs outside of Ireland as only costs incurred in Ireland are eligible for the award. Artists will first apply by submitting a residency proposal. If successful a formal letter of offer will be issued granting the award and inviting the artist to work at the Sculpture Centre for a specified period during the coming year.

Residency Proposals

There is no application form and submissions are in the form of a Residency Project Proposal that should outline the areas of technical, material or theoretical involvement and describe the creative approach, methodology or processes to be undertaken or explored. Residency Proposals should include the following:

- A Project Proposal (up to 1 page).
- Between 6 - 10 images jpegs of previous work with captions explaining material, size, date etc. or up to 6 examples of written or published work
- An up-to-date CV
- An artist statement and bio no more than ½ page each
- A suggested timeline for the project

Selection Criteria

- Quality of previous work
- Relevance of project proposal to this residency scheme
- Innovation within approaches to the materials, ideas and processes.
- The capacity of the proposed project to support the artist-researcher develop new work and/or ideas in the advancement of their practice

Timeline

Due to accommodation restrictions all residencies will take place in August, September or November 2019. Please specify which month suits.

Deadline for applications: 1st MAY 2019
Notification by: 15th May 2019
